Mike Harvey

What is your vision of mountain biking in Nelson Tasman

The top of the South is a natural playground. Tasman is the only region in the entire country that faces north and has a vast natural basin encircled by mountain ranges to the South, it would be a crime not to grow mountain biking and other outdoor pursuits in our region. I enjoy mountain biking, cross-country walking and race moto-x so I'm with you.

What is your vision of general cycling for transport and recreation in Nelson Tasman

It's the future, e-bikes and scooters are reducing travel time to work in many places, this is reducing the impact of carbon fuels and the frustration of congested roads. Longer term, less road congestion equals less ratepayers' money being spent on maintaining high-use traffic zones. To support the investment to implement the Walking and Cycling Strategy and the completion of the TGTT as well as the planned conversion of the Kingsland Forest behind Richmond into permanent forest species that enables the further development of walking and cycling tracks and links to the Silvan Hills MTB park

I see the economic benefits being realised by those running events or tourism businesses leveraging off the investments made by Councils private landowners and DoC in the underlying infrastructure.

How much funding are you prepared to invest to realise the potential of mountain biking over the next 3 years?

Given all the challenges facing the next Council I cannot commit to providing any funding directly to mountain biking over the next three years as the priority for investment in cycling is the delivery of the urban cycle way networks and complete the TGTT

Very difficult question, as the park is owned by DoC I believe it is primarily their role to support the Park itself, the road access is equally challenging as there are many roads that Council doesn't maintain for the full length and any decision to increase funding to access the MTB Park will have to be weighed up against the other roads around the region that communities would like to see upgraded and maintained.
