Celia Butler

What is your vision of mountain biking in Nelson Tasman

I envisage some more mountain bike tracks, particularly down the western side of the Takaka Hill, but only where resources exist to maintain them. Connecting across the Takaka Hill would be good. New tracks provide more access for pest control. We have seen the success of this at Rameka. A lot depends on landowners. I dont support any more existing walking tracks being opened to mountain biking eg Abel Tasman.

What is your vision of general cycling for transport and recreation in Nelson Tasman

Cycle paths are connected with each other to provide continuous travel. Off road seperate cycle paths are the ideal in some situations, recognising that there is maintenance required. Cycle paths that deviate a lot from the road are nice for recreation, but cycling for transport comes first and people will choose the shortest route, especially school children. Surfacing is preferably hard, but gravel will be necessary in some places as hard surfaces are expensive.

That TDC implements the Walking and Cycling Strategy as adopted by council in 2022. Advocate for mountain bike projects.

The huge uptake in electric bikes needs the support of sufficient infrastructure. If re-elected I'll be supporting any endeavour relating to cycling.
