

5. Financial Report

- Income 559,000, down from \$733,000 previous year, largely due to no longer acting as middle person between council and contractors
- Net Income was a loss of \$4.K from a loss of \$127k in 2022.

- Event season starts in June.
 - Winter DH was hit badly by the August floods.
 - Cyclocross Thanks to Vaughan, this is a great event for the whole family.
 - Crosscountry Thanks to Paul, another great community event suitable for all.
 - Super D Thanks to Loui + Jess. Super D can get up to 200 riders. It's low key and fun. The funds from Super D supported three local riders to race overseas.
 - Gorge The event season included two events at the Gorge including the final of the Super D season. It was great to have everyone there. Thanks to Greg for his support with Gorge events.
 - Shred like a Girl Thanks to Mel and Juliana. Fun women's only event.
- 2023 events have so far included R3 of the National DH Series, including many top level riders. Thanks to NRDA and NCC for their support with the DH race
- The second event for 2023 was the National Enduro Champs at Cable Bay.
 Lots of work was done behind the scenes to secure the events. Thanks to
 Loui and Jess + Cable Bay team for helping to secure this. Feedback has been fantastic and the event was world class.
- Social events have been challenging in the current climate with people working longer and harder. NMTBC is currently looking at how they can increase social events.

7. General Business/Feedback

Matt B - Strength of mountain biking in Nelson is fantastic. Through floods, covid, fire etc the community has come together to keep the network going and improve.

Questions and Answers

Q Is the Maitai Hub going to be fixed?

Yes - it will take time. It needs the right contractor to get it repaired and careful planning.

Q Where are we at with TDC trails

We are working on building a positive relationship with TDC that will hopefully result in more trails in the Richmond Hills. NMTBC is in the process of working towards establishing a MOU with TDC.

Q - Is the Maitai Hub Insured?

NCC representative answered - the August floods were a once in a lifetime event. The pump track saved the Golf Course buildings.

Q - Is the Gorge making a profit?

It is breaking even. It isn't a drain on the club finances. The road is a liability.

Q - Was the youth/family day successful?

Yes - it was really popular. We are planning more in the future. It is important to note that families are welcome all the time. It is hard to change the perception of the Gorge being hard and too full on for many.

Q - what is the short and long term plan for trails?

The plan is in the Out and About Strategy. NMTBC has a positive relationship with stakeholders, we need to secure land access before committing to starting new builds. The reality of building a new trail is that it requires lots of work behind the scenes. NMTBC wants to build "non-removable trails."

Q - Does the club have a strategy for where they will build in the future?

Yes. As above - it is in the Out and About Strategy. NMTBC is looking to build more trails outside of pine forests.

Q - Where is the land access at the moment?

NCC representative answered - Ngati Koata bought the land in 2014 and now NCC and NMTBC would like to secure access to this area. NCC is working really hard with Ngati Koata to secure future proof access. It will be exciting in the future.

Q - Do we know how many riders are using the trails?

Reports suggest about 8000 local mountain bikers.

Yes - we are speaking with NCC and NRDA to understand how we can utilise shuttles and vehicle access. Logistics need to be worked through for shuttles. Silvan is potentially keen to have a DH track in the future.					
JC noted that he and JC are really passionate about DH and really want to keep it alive.					
Q - Is there any possibility for more youth development at the entry level?					
Yes - we want to get a portfolio holder to push and focus on youth development. Sport Tasman are keen to support youth into riding.					
Comment - It is good to reflect on how lucky we are and how amazing the Gorge is!
